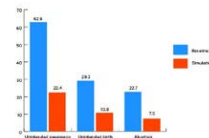

Increasing the Use of Effective Contraception

Nearly half of all U.S. pregnancies are unintended. This can have negative consequences for the health and well-being of women and children, and comes at significant public cost. Child Trends researchers were commissioned by the Planned Parenthood Action Fund to estimate, with the microsimulation model FamilyScape, nationwide pregnancy outcomes if all women not seeking pregnancy used the same mix of effective contraceptive methods as women at Planned Parenthood clinics who had participated in a recent evaluation study conducted by researchers from the University of California, San Francisco. [Among the findings](#) -- an estimated 64 percent decrease in unintended pregnancies and a 67 percent decrease in abortions nationwide.

CDC Winnable Battles

CDC Winnable Battles

In 2010, the US Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) identified 6 focus areas termed *Winnable Battles*, in which concerted effort could lead to substantial health improvement in a short time.¹ Teams selected a limited set of strategies that could enable rapid progress, established ambitious targets, aligned efforts within the CDC, and worked with federal and other partners to leverage each entity's capacity.

Changes to 340B Recertification

Changes Coming to 340B Recertification for Title X and STD

NFPRHA has heard from staff at the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Office of Pharmacy Affairs that this year Title X and CDC 318 STD providers will have their 340B recertification periods at the same time. Exact dates for the recertification period will be announced soon, but it will likely be sometime around late April through early May. This change means that those entities that are registered in the 340B database with both family planning and STD IDs will have to recertify twice in the same period, once under each ID.
