340B Recertification for Title X and 318 STD Announced

340B Recertification for Title X and 318 STD Announced



The Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) Office of Pharmacy Affairs has announced the dates for this year's 340B recertification period for Title X and CDC 318 STD providers. The recertification period is tentatively scheduled for April 25-May 22, 2017. HRSA will host a recertification webinar on April 19, 2017. More details on the webinar will be sent out by HRSA after April 1.

Authorizing officials will receive email notification of the recertification period, including the link necessary to access the recertification.

A reminder that recertification for Title X and CDC 318 STD have been merged this year. Providers that are registered for 340B under both programs will be required to recertify twice during this upcoming recertification period, once for each 340B ID. Failure to recertify will result in termination.

A team of experts in pediatric, adolescent and women's health reviewed years of data to come to their conclusion that the pill, already the most popular form of hormonal birth control in the U.S., should be available with even fewer restrictions. Job Overview

This position serves as a Section Supervisor and is responsible for, 1) program development; 2) program operations; and 3) staff supervision.

- Coordinates and conducts strategic planning to develop and establish plans that are aligned with the broader bureau and division goals and objectives.
- Establishes section goals, objectives and work plans to guide program and grand administration.

Develops, writes and implements section and program policies, rules and regulations related to program/service delivery improvement including changes to administrative rules, and interpreting state and federal regulations.

- Evaluate the impact of programs on public health improvement/disease prevention efforts and determine areas for improvement.
- Ensure coordination with local and tribal health agencies, local health officials, and health professionals to meet program goals and objectives.
- Conduct research and analysis to evaluate information on successful program policies and procedures regarding program/service delivery improvement.
- Write grant applications to seek additional program funding through federal and other sources.

Minimum Qualifications Education and Experience

- Bachelor's degree in health sciences, behavioral/social sciences or a closely related field.
- Five years of progressively responsible experience that includes program planning and administration.
- Other combinations of directly related education and experience may be considered on a case-by-case basis.
