2017 Heartland Conference



Inspired by the Northwest Alcohol Conference!

The Heartland Conference was inspired by the Northwest Alcohol Conference (NoWAC). At the 2016 conference, Galloway encouraged others to start their own conference.

The Wichita Mountains Prevention Network and their partners are hosting the 1st Heartland Alcohol & Substance Abuse Conference. This Regional Heartland Conference will take place October 11th-12th, 2017 at the Embassy Suites in Norman, OK. A block of rooms will be available at the Embassy Suites, for check-in on October 10th. The objective of this two-day conference is to educate substance abuse prevention specialists, educators (from higher education and secondary education), law enforcement, tribal entities, coalitions, and community members.

Oklahoma, like most of the country, is currently going through numerous legislative changes concerning alcohol and substance use. This year alone Oklahomans voted to approve Alcohol Modernization and a total rewrite of the alcoholic beverage statutes. Oklahoma also passed legislation this year making simple possession of ANY NARCOTIC or CONTROLLED SUBSTANCE a misdemeanor.

Conferences bringing together prevention and enforcement are a need more than ever in the era of deregulation and modernization. Call for presentation proposals, award nominations, and sponsorship opportunities will be posted soon, with additional details. Currently keynote speakers are being contacted and selected. There will also be poster presentations from college students, with a discounted registration rate for students.

Norman is 25 minutes from Will Rogers Airport in Oklahoma City. Not only is Norman well known for the University of Oklahoma Sooners, but it is also a great location to eat, shop, and visit.
