### **What is the Substance Abuse Prevention Skills Training (SAPST)?**

The Substance Abuse Prevention Skills Training (SAPST) is a foundational course of study in substance abuse prevention that blends a four-day, in-person component with an interactive online unit. Grounded in current research and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration's (SAMHSA) Strategic Prevention Framework, the SAPST helps individuals develop knowledge and skills to implement effective, data-driven prevention interventions that reduce behavioral health disparities and improve wellness. In addition to the four days of trainings, participants will need to complete an on-line course prior to the training.
